The two separate obligations to attend Mass (Sunday and one for Christmas/New Year's) are both important and are met **by attending two separate Masses per weekend**. The Sunday obligation can be fulfilled by attending Mass on Saturday evening or Sunday morning. The Christmas/New Year's obligation can be fulfilled at Mass on Sunday evening or Monday. However, **the same Mass cannot meet both obligations**.
