


Daily Rosary prayer initiative requested by the Holy Father:

Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

Each year, the Sunday following the Solemnity of Pentecost commemorates the Mystery of the Most Blessed Trinity. It is the Mystery of God Himself. The Catechism teaches that “by sending His only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time, God has revealed His innermost secret: God Himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and He has destined us to share in that exchange.” As the central mystery of Christian faith and life, the Mystery of the Most Blessed Trinity reveals to us the truth about God and the truth about man, the human person created in God’s image and likeness. For this reason, the worship of God in the profession of the true faith is the surest guarantee of a life of meaningful purpose.
