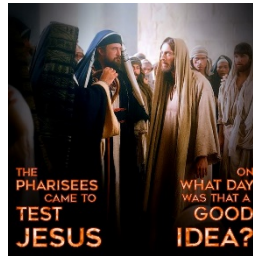
Sunday Offeratory Envelopes for 2022
