Report on Talk on Birthright by Marie Sardinha at Blessed Sacrament CWL General Meeting held March 11, 2014

Introduced by Shirley McDonald at 7:25 P.M.

Ms. Sardinha was happy to join our members and parishioners to speak about her part as a volunteer with Birthright, an organization serving Kingston since 1971, providing caring, loving, non-judgmental support to women and girls who are distressed by an unplanned pregnancy. All Birthright services are free and confidential. Birthright services are available to women of any age, race, creed, economic or marital status.

She talked about Birthright's need to advertise more and how they are presently buying into social media advertising. In order to pay for this promotion she asked us to help fundraise- by selling little pins, or filling small baby bottles with money. It was suggested that she could bring a larger baby bottle to the CWL Convention in May and ask for donations there. We also suggested having a booth at our Snowflake Bazaar this year.

Birthright needs \$18,000 annually to stay open – costs are rent, insurance, phone and yellow pages advertisement and brochures. They are funded strictly by charitable donations.

At the end of her dialogue, she was presented with a cheque from our council and a number of donated baby items for the moms and their babies. She gave us a heartfelt thank you.
